

Dear Parents, carers and staff,

It's with a great sense of humility that I am able to write to you this term as the Executive Principal of the VSL, following my official appointment to the position earlier this term. The long history of the school, and the work of many people before me, do not go unrecognised, and in particular I thank once again retiring principal Frank Merlino for his custodianship of the school for many years.

The Victorian School of Languages is now positioned to move into a new era, and you will have already noticed from this Bulletin that we have a new logo as the symbolic representation of our school. With this new era comes the opportunity put information systems into place which will support the scale of our work, and to better reach our vast community. Late last year we developed a four year strategic plan which provides us with the focus of our work, and we have already seen great inroads into our improvement agenda.

We are committed to joining together our collective knowledge and the expertise of many teachers across our school, so that we can benefit from their wisdom. Across our 42 centres around the state, we have begun to meet and learn together in language groups and to develop a continuum of language learning for our students in all the languages we teach at the VSL. This work is complex given our scale, but we know that with the dedication of our staff we will be able to achieve our goal to have completed this continuum from Foundation to Year 10 by 2027.

Our work will focus on improving the quality of teaching and learning at the VSL to ensure that our young people have the best opportunity available to them to excel in their acquisition of their language of choice. Once again, we can be proud of our VCE achievements, with 19 students to receive Premier's Awards next month. It is an outstanding outcome, and indicative the quality work of the VSL teachers, our students and the families who support them. Earlier this term, I was pleased to meet with the Portuguese Consul, Nino Godinho who distributed iPads to all students studying Portuguese at our Collingwood Centre. It was a very exciting morning for the parents of the students lucky enough to be in receipt of this technology while they are studying at the VSL, and we are grateful to the Consul for their support.

In addition, we were visited at our Keilor Centre and our Head Office by Mr Cem GENCOGLU, Turkish Vice-Consul (Education), who expressed their desire to support our school and encourage the continued provision of Turkish across the VSL.

They have prepared the end of semester reports to provide parents and carers with the chance to see the progress of their child/children, and I encourage you to talk with them around their language learning this term.

I look forward to working with you all to continue the fine work of the Victorian School of Languages.

GERMAN LANGUAGE ASSISTANT

The VSL is privileged to once again be a part of the Language Assistant Program, supported by the Victorian Department of Education. Language assistants are usually native speakers of one of the languages taught in Victorian schools and provide crucial support to teachers to develop students' speaking skills, create resources, and much more. But this is not just a one-way relationship. Language assistants are often aspiring teachers in their home country, and they come to Victoria to gain experience in a different context, while also being part of a school community and learning about a new culture.

This year we have been joined by Lucas Adam, a German language assistant, who hails from a village called Haustadt in the tiny German federal state of Saarland. After arriving at the beginning of Term Two, Lucas has already proven to be a valuable asset to our distance education German team, supporting students with oral work via videoconference, and teachers with the preparation and execution of face-to-face seminars. He has also begun to spend some Saturday mornings in our centre classes, working with students at the University High School centre from Year 1 through to Year 12. Other centres will no doubt see Lucas during Term Three.

Welcome, Lucas! We hope you have a great time as a part of our team at the VSL, and of course we wish you a wonderful stay in Australia. With two current members of our teaching staff in the German faculty having been previous participants in the program, who knows what the future holds?!
